First-Year Family Members: Remind Your Student to Confirm their Participation in STEP

The Second-year Transformational Experience Program (STEP) is a one-of-a-kind opportunity created to enhance the success of second-year students at Ohio State. Participants will:

- Develop a meaningful relationship with a faculty mentor and small group of peers.
- Identify ways to enhance personal, academic, and career goals.
- Strengthen communication and networking skills with support from peers and a faculty mentor committed to your student's success.
- Be eligible for a fellowship of up to \$2,000 to engage in a STEP Signature Project in one or more of the following areas: servicelearning, education abroad, internships, leadership, undergraduate research, or creative/artistic endeavors.

Now is the time when current first-year students confirm their participation in STEP. We encourage you to discuss the program with your student and remind them to confirm their participation by March 24, 2023. Students will select their fall semester STEP cohort meeting time in summer 2023.

- If your student already expressed interest in STEP during the Housing Reselection process, they were recently emailed a link to review the STEP Participant Requirements and confirm their participation.
- If your student did not express interest in STEP, it's not too late! Please have them email step@osu.edu to request to participate in the program.



Supporting Student Academic Excellence

A note from SpringForward:

When students mention time-management as a challenge, we begin by asking them how they spend their time. What we usually find is that students have less of a time-management issue and instead have a commitment issue.

A definition of Commitment: the state or quality of being dedicated to a cause, activity, etc. There are two ways a student might lack commitment. They may have the time to devote to academics, but they choose not to, or they do not have the time to devote themselves, due to other commitments and obligations. Both result in less time committed to academics, which might be described as a time-management issue. The reality is, college is difficult, and requires more time than students are often willing to commit. If they have not committed to college and the challenges it creates, they will not be successful in school and will struggle to gain the most out of their education. If your student is in their first year, learn how the SpringForward summer scholarship program can help using the link below (deadline is March 27). All students are eligible to meet with the Dennis Learning Center for 1:1 academic coaching which can address time management and academic commitment as well.

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




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
