Safety Spotlight

Off-Campus Community Crime Map

The Community Crime Map consists of statistics from the Columbus Division of Police (CPD) and shows off-campus crime reports. Ohio State has preprogrammed the map to a one-mile radius to include the crime reports from the most recent 7-day period. The default crime categories are predetermined by LexisNexis. Users also can <u>set up customized email alerts</u>. Stay informed of crime reports in your student's neighborhood by visiting the Community Crime Map.

Buckeye Alert system test

A Buckeye Alert system test will occur March 27. Students, faculty and staff on all Ohio State campuses will receive a text message that will be clearly identified as a test. Due to texting requirements by cellular carriers, "Urgent Buckeye Alert" will appear in the text to indicate the urgent nature of the message. If a Buckeye Alert is issued, information will also be posted at <u>emergency.osu.edu</u>. If your cell phone number is in Workday (for faculty/staff) or BuckeyeLink (for students), you are automatically registered for the Buckeye Alert text messaging system. Faculty, staff and students have the ability to register up to two additional cell phone numbers to receive text message notifications. The system also sends severe weather alerts to the entire university community for tornado warnings.

First-year family members: Remind your student to confirm their participation in STEP

The Second-year Transformational Experience Program (STEP) is a one-of-akind opportunity created to enhance the success of second-year students at Ohio State. Participants will:

- Develop a meaningful relationship with a faculty mentor and small group of peers.
- Identify ways to enhance personal, academic, and career goals.
- Strengthen communication and networking skills with support from peers and a faculty mentor committed to your student's success.
- Be eligible for a fellowship of up to \$2,000 to engage in a STEP Signature Project in one or more of the following areas: service-learning, education abroad, internships, leadership, undergraduate research, or creative/artistic endeavors.

Now is the time when current first-year students confirm their participation in STEP. We encourage you to discuss the program with your student and remind them to confirm their participation by March 24, 2023. Students will select their fall semester STEP cohort meeting time in summer 2023.

- If your student already expressed interest in STEP during the Housing Reselection process, they were recently emailed a link to review the STEP Participant Requirements and confirm their participation.

Getting around campus

Cannon/Herrick intersection closes, traffic/CABS rerouted

From March 27 through the end of August, the Cannon/Herrick intersection and the Herrick Bridge will be closed. Traffic, including CABS, will be rerouted via Woody Hayes to Cannon to Herrick via a new temporary road through the Lincoln lot. All traffic should follow detour signs. From March 27 to mid-May, Herrick east of Cannon will be reduced to one lane, with two-way traffic maintained via a temporary signal for one month. The South Campus Chiller parking lot will close. Starting mid-May, the Olentangy Trail will be rerouted around Ohio Stadium. Major traffic delays are anticipated. Cannon Drive closures will proceed north to Woody Hayes through the end of 2024. The closures support Cannon Drive Relocation – Phase 2.
